Global Village

These paper dolls are wonderful to combine with the Global Village Paper. They can easily be turned into old-fashioned paper dolls, displayed in chains and hung. Or create a globe and arrange dolls around the total outside edge.

Grade Levels K-5

Note: instructions and materials based on a class of 25 students. Adjust as needed.

Process

- 1. Choose a country by identifying the paper patterns. Choose a doll.
- 2. Use the doll as a pattern to trace the clothes. Cut and add hats and shoes if applicable. Use the construction paper also.
- 3. Lightly glue each piece. Think about clothing trim and perhaps baskets, purses, canes or animals.
