

# Global Village

These paper dolls are wonderful to combine with the Global Village Paper. They can easily be turned into old-fashioned paper dolls, displayed in chains and hung. Or create a globe and arrange dolls around the total outside edge.

## Grade Levels K-5

*Note: instructions and materials based on a class of 25 students. Adjust as needed.*

## Process

1. Choose a country by identifying the paper patterns. Choose a doll.
2. Use the doll as a pattern to trace the clothes. Cut and add hats and shoes if applicable. Use the construction paper also.
3. Lightly glue each piece. Think about clothing trim and perhaps baskets, purses, canes or animals.



## Options

1. Use the Railroad Board as a background to create a village that changes by geographical identifications. Palm tree, then mountains, then deserts running into each other in a background.
