# **Goofy Mask**

Anything goes! Lots of texture, color and dimension.

The cultural diversity in the United States provides for many, many masks which represent traditional images. This fun mask requires children to create a mask just for themselves. Provide the materials, below, and encourage children to bring in items from home - rice, dried beans, leaves, etc.

#### Grade Levels K-4

Note: instructions and materials based on a class of 25 students. Adjust as needed.

#### **Process**

- 1. Use the paper pulp form as a base. This can be cut out, sewn, painted and more.
- 2. Children choose their materials. Suggest curling Kraft stems, marbles, screws, twigs, plastic utensils.
- 3. The Weldbond glue will attach everything and dry clear.
- 4. Suggest adding to the outside of the mask to develop dimension.

#### **Options**

- Use all natural materials make eyes from rocks. Paint on them and macaroni and beans.
- Fabric pieces can be glued.
- Paper mask construction paper, corrugated paper, newspaper, and magazine paper.
